Street Supervisor

Summary:

Under general supervision, the Supervisor of Street Maintenance provides direct supervision and oversees the daily activities of employees assigned to street maintenance related activities and operates a comprehensive street and drainage infrastructure maintenance program.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

- 1. Supervise, work with, assist, and coordinate work crews performing both skilled and unskilled work for street maintenance operations.
- 2. Implement operational activities to meet goals in the division annual work plan, yearly street inventory, annual segment of the 5 year street maintenance plan and street sweeping procedure.
- 3. Supervise, direct and evaluate assigned staff, processing employee concerns and problems, directing work, counseling, disciplining and completing employee performance appraisals.
- 4. Inspect equipment to ensure scheduled maintenance and operating procedures are followed, reporting malfunctions to appropriate fleet service supervisor.
- 5. Operate the work order system that tracks efficiency, effectiveness and cost of maintenance projects. Prepare or complete various forms, schedules, work orders, work estimates, or other documents.
- 6. Communicate with management, co-workers, vendors, customers, the public, and other individuals as needed to coordinate work activities, resolve problems.
- 7. Operate trucks of various sizes and weighs in the loading, hauling and unloading of various equipment, materials, and supplies.
- 8. Operate trucks and construction or power equipment, such as mechanized broom, backhoe, man-lift, dump truck, motor grader, front-end loader
- 9. Operate small equipment and tools to maintain street and utility system
- 10. Perform other duties as assigned.

Qualifications:

- Graduation from high school or GED equivalent, at least four (4) years' experience involving the use of medium and heavy equipment related to street maintenance; supervisory experience
- While performing the duties of this job, the employee regularly works in outside weather conditions. The employee works a forty (40) hour week along with a rotating weekend (on-call) schedule.
- Valid Texas Motor Vehicle License; CDL License
