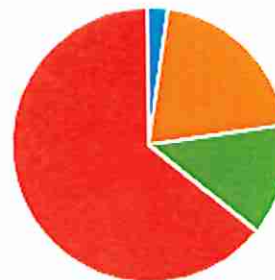

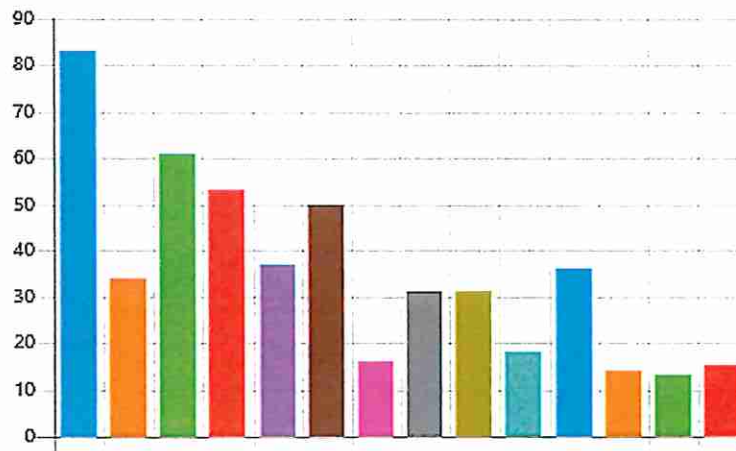

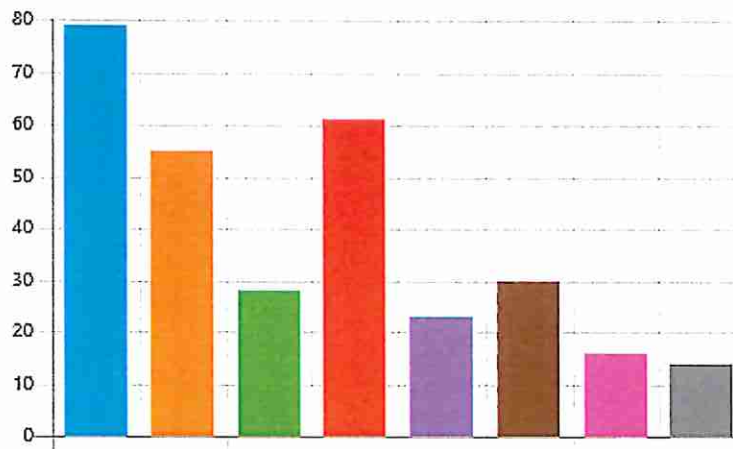
6. If the City had additional funding available, which area should receive the greatest investment?

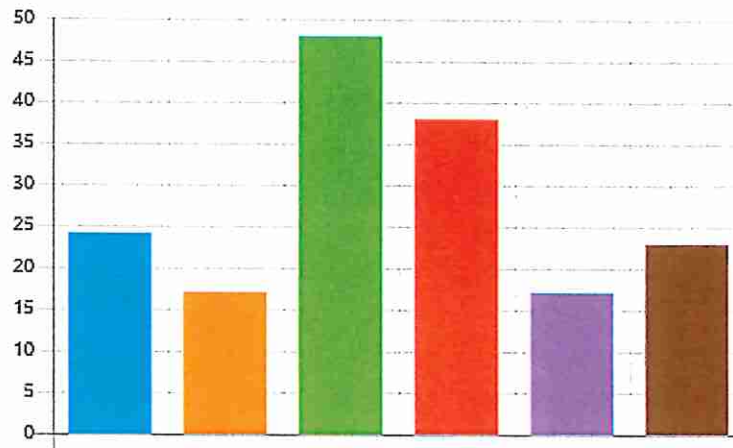
7. Which of the following potential projects would you most support? (Select up to two)

If this project proceeds, developers—not taxpayers—should bear the cost of infrastructure upgrades required to support it. Charging developers appropriately for road improvements, utility expansion, and environmental mitigation would protect existing residents and businesses from bearing the burden of private development.
